

### *Lost Worlds: Sacred Wonders of Britain*

**\*\*Premiere\*\***

Sunday, 18 May at 7.30pm on SBS ONE (3-part series)

Neil Oliver goes on a journey to reveal the sacred face of Britain, an ancient landscape of belief and ritual that still lies hidden just below the surface of the modern world.

In the first of a three part series, Neil Oliver sets off on in search of the Sacred Wonders of Britain. What was is it about Britain's rich and varied landscape that inspired their ancestors to express their beliefs by reshaping the world around them? What did they see in the countryside that led them to deem some places more sacred than others and why are people still drawn back to those places today? Over the three part series, Neil Oliver also goes in search of Bronze and Iron Age sites sacred to ancient Britons and discovers how the early church created a new generation of sacred wonders.

#### **Episode One:**

In the first program, Neil is in search of the very first stirrings of religion in Britain. In the south of England and on the Scottish borders great tombs are evidence of ancestor worship among the first farmers of the Neolithic and an extraordinary discovery in Herefordshire reveals what really lies beneath their burial mounds. In the flint mines of Grimes Graves in Norfolk, he discovers how stone age miners carried their religion deep underground. In the great stone circle and henge of Avebury and the monuments of Orkney, he'll discover how a new age of belief swept away the old religions and changed Britain forever.

Known for its spectacular mountain stages, the 2014 edition of the race will begin in Belfast, Northern Ireland before heading to the capital Dublin, and then on to Italy, where the race will conclude in Trieste.

### *Secrets of the Manor House* **\*\*Premiere\*\***

Thursday, 22 May at 7.30pm on SBS ONE

One hundred years ago, the British manor house was in its heyday, sheltering families of enormous wealth and privilege within its stately walls. But what was really going on behind closed doors, where these wealthy families and their poor servants coexisted?

**Secrets of the Manor House** goes inside two of Britain's most legendary manor houses, Manderston in Berwickshire and Dunham Massey, former home of the Earl of Stamford, to discover the secrets behind the uncover what went on behind the facades of these great houses.

During the Edwardian era, a hidden army of up to 300 servants tended to every need of an aristocratic family. In 1901, there were more than 1.5 million servants in Britain and grand estates occupied half the land. The tradition of primogeniture ensured that they were handed down to the first-born son. With the Industrial Revolution, wealth began moving away from agriculture and into manufacturing and banking. While the easiest solution would have been to sell some of their land, the practice of entailment demanded that estates be passed on intact. Many aristocrats, finding themselves in need of cash, married rich American heiresses in a trend that was quietly called "cash for titles."

### *Luke Nguyen's France* **\*\*New Episode\*\*** Thursday, 22 May at 7.30pm on SBS ONE (10-Part Series)

**Luke Nguyen's France** follows Luke's latest journey as his appetite for food leads him out of Asia and into France, the culinary wonderland that shaped his ancestral home, Vietnam, and the lives of so many in his family. Experience a whole new world of French Vietnamese fusion food as Luke travels around France creating dishes that boast the richness of Gallic tradition with a fresh, modern Asian twist.

Over ten half hour episodes, Luke ventures through the fascinating nation of France. Beginning in Paris, Luke circumnavigates the country: Paris to Strasbourg; the Franche-Comté to Lyon; Marseille to Nice; Biarritz to Île d'Oléron and finally, St Malo. Luke's love of food coupled with his disarming nature unearths a side to the French food culture and lifestyle that has rarely been seen on television. Local characters open their homes and share family recipes, fusing the taste of France with that of Spain, Africa and Vietnam.

#### **Episode Five:**

Luke heads to Lyon, the food capital of France. He makes a classic salad Lyonnaise after teaming up with celebrity chef Grégory Cuilleron, then explores Lyon's famous silk tunnels. Luke has a wine early in the morning with his old friend Momo before setting up a kitchen in the middle of a farmers' market. The men wax lyrical about Lyonnaise food culture while creating a dessert inspired by the fruits of spring. Luke checks out some trompe-l'œil art and is invited into the kitchen of one of France's most respected chefs, Jean-Paul Lacombe. He learns the secret behind making a traditional chicken liver cake with Arlette, one of Lyon's most beloved Bouchon cooks.

SBS builds on its reputation for offering the world's best dramas by bringing Fargo - a new 10-part series inspired by the classic 90s film of the same name - to Australian screens only weeks after its US debut.

With the original film's masterminds Joel and Ethan Coen as Executive Producers, the series boasts a killer cast led by the inimitable Billy Bob Thornton (Sling Blade), as well as Hollywood heavyweights Martin Freeman (The Hobbit, The Office), Colin Hanks (Mad Men, Dexter) and Bob Odenkirk (Breaking Bad).

Fargo follows an all-new "true" crime case with new characters, all entrenched in the trademark humour, murder and "Minnesota nice" that made the Academy Award-winning film an enduring classic. Oscar winner Thornton stars as Lorne Malvo, a rootless, manipulative man who meets and forever changes the life of small town insurance salesman Lester Nygaard, played by BAFTA Award winner Freeman. Thornton, Freeman, Hanks and Odenkirk are joined by Golden Globe and Emmy-nominated Oliver Platt, Screen Actors Guild Award winner Kate Walsh, Adam Goldberg, plus many more surprise appearances.

### ***This is Brazil! \*\*New Episode\*\****

Friday, 23 May at 7.30pm on SBS ONE (6-part series)

In the lead up to the 2014 FIFA World Cup, **This is Brazil!** showcases the vibrant colour and culture of the 12 Brazilian capital cities that will play host to one of the most highly anticipated and exciting sporting events in the world.

This six part series is hosted by Brazilian-born Australian Fernanda de Paula, who heads home to rediscover her roots, exploring Brazil's cultural diversity, viewing daily life through the eyes of local chefs, musicians, artists and everyday workers. From the pounding drums of the Afro-Brazilian capital, Salvador, to the floating villages of the Amazon, she meets the people that infuse everyday life in Brazil with passion.

#### **Episode Four: Rio de Janeiro, Recife, Porto Alegre & Manaus**

It's time for one of the biggest events on the Brazilian calendar: Carnival! Fernanda begins at the official Carnival parade, which is actually a very serious competition held at the Sambadrome, a purpose-built arena. Up early the next day, she travels to the north eastern city of Recife for a unique street celebration featuring huge, colourful puppets. Heading south to the port city of Porto Alegre, the cultural contrast is huge. The city is home to Brazilian cowboys, known as Gaúchos, who are responsible for the famous Brazilian barbecue and a special tea that comes in wooden gourds. Then it's on to Manaus, the biggest city in the Amazon. About 100 years ago it was one of the richest cities in the world due to its rubber trade. Beautiful buildings, including the Amazonas Theatre, were constructed back then using only the finest European materials. Its golden era lasted 30 years until a rubber seed was stolen and taken to Asia. Fernanda is also taken on a medicinal tour of indigenous fruits fresh from the Amazon rainforest.


